Grace and peace to you Westminster Presbyterian Church -

I am writing this article just a couple days shy of our first 2 months together.

One of my main priorities has been establishing a strong working relationship with Session, the church committees, and each member of the staff. There are many capable folks in each of these places and I am grateful for their wisdom and expertise. Likewise, I have enjoyed getting to know many of you on Zoom and in worship on Sunday mornings. I hope to spend time with each of the 18 Deacon care groups this coming summer in some smaller settings (stay tuned).

I know we are in weird times. Are infections going up? (yes.) Are vaccines going up? (yes). Do we still need to wear masks? (yes). Are we all ready for this to be over? (yes). Because 14+ months is long enough to rearrange our internal worlds and to reshape our external habits, what was 'normal' is looking further and further away in the rear view mirror. What about the church is feeling different for you? I recognize that along with Covid, Westminster also had the retirement of a number of long time staff in a short period of time. It's a lot of change at once. Here is one of my favorite quotes about how we experience times like this-

For a seed to achieve its greatest expression, it must come completely undone. The shell cracks, its insides come out and everything changes. To someone who doesn't understand growth, it would look like complete destruction (Cynthis Occelli).

The cracking open can make growth look like destruction! Think about infancy and adolescence, two of the times in our lives when we crack open the most and our growth is exponential. Usually they are welcomed seasons but not without their growing pains and some angst. Almost every church is facing this level of change. Covid has brought to light in an undeniable way the massive shifts in cultural patterns (church attendance habits, family income, declining birth rates, civic participation, demands on time, etc) over the past 50 years. Those patterns have very real impacts on how churches plan their programs. What I appreciate about being a pastor during this chapter in our collective life together, is that it is the time for the entrepreneurs, the visionaries, and the creatives to shine in our faith communities. The church of the future will be built by those who can see a picture what might be and by those who can hear the symphony amidst the chaos.

#### CATCHING UP WITH SESSION

Here's a summary of business from the April 21st Session Meeting:

- Approved having a summer retreat for elders to help design our future; members to be invited.
- Agreed to consider additional 1-hr monthly Zoom meetings to discuss special topics.
- Guest Nancy MacMorris-Adix reviewed the Appreciative Inquiry process and its conclusions.
- Approved setting up a checking account at Columbia Bank for Pastor Kelly's Flexible Spending Account.
- Guest Bill Foster proposed forming a new Gifts Endowments and Memorials committee (GEMS); session decision delayed until May.
- Approved the following individuals as signers for the Westminster Presbyterian Church account at Columbia Bank established for Pastor Kelly's Flexible Spending Account: Herbert Sims, William (Bill) Foster, Cynthia Chinnock, and Thomas (TC) Curlee.
- Approved periodically transferring funds to or from other church depository accounts to maintain a balance of approximately \$100,000 in the church's main operating checking account.
- Approved "Be Bold Street Ministries" as the 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday Donation Drive recipient for our next 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday at the end of May.
- Directed Mission Peace Eco Justice committee bring back to the May Session meeting a proposal to initiate a 2021 stimulus donation program similar to the 2020 donation program and terminate the program on 31 December 2021.
- Approved supporting partnership endorsement for Church@thePark.
- Approved extending Creation Month activities to May 2.
- Approved submitting a grant application to the Presbytery of the Cascades for the Brisbee Fund Community Ministry.
- Approved Oregon Music Educators Association hold a meeting at WPC on June 3.
- Accepted Bill Nelson's resignation as Chair of Stewardship with gratitude for his service.
- Approved Jan Carlson to serve the remaining two years of Bill Nelson's term as Chair of Stewardship.
- Set installation / ordination date for new deacons and elders on May 16 in both worship services.
- Set Installation date for Pastor Kelly on May 16 at 3:00 p.m.
- Approved inviting new elders to the May session meeting.



#### CONNECTING WITH GOD AND OTHERS DURING THE PANDEMIC

My sister and I are very close and love spending time together. We don't live in the same town, so we typically talk on the phone often. We were at the coast together March 2020 just as everything was shutting down. With stay-at-home orders coming, we wanted to stay more closely connected and support each other through the upcoming challenges.

In the past we had done occasional Bible studies together. We decided to make it a regular daily practice. We use the Bible app from Life.Church. We take turns selecting topics and plans for our daily study. There are so many plans on any topic you can imagine and range from 3 days to 365 days. We read the daily devotion and scripture, answer the question "What is God saying to me today?" and then talk about it in more detail. Usually we talk on the phone, but we have also used both FaceTime and Zoom for these studies.

We've deepened our faith, challenged each other, and become even closer through our study. Some of the plans we've done include Faith Instead of Fear in the Pandemic, Truth for Dark Days, Trusting God in the Eye of the Storm, Grace for the Moment, and Hopeful Living. Our current study is 100 Days with Jesus, Advent, Ministry and Passion. It's a very personal walk with Jesus which opened our eyes to new ways of seeing Jesus through the eyes of the people around Him. It has been a real blessing to share this with my sister. We will continue our daily study as the benefits are so great.

#### Westminster Reads Returns this Summer

Last summer Adult Education launched Westminster Reads Book Club, and we successfully read and discussed *The Brothers K."* Due to popular demand, Westminster Reads will return this summer with the book *Year of Wonders*, by Geraldine Brooks, a Penguin publication. It is a classic God vs. Nature novel about how a remote English village responds to the "Black Death" in 1666.

When the plague visits an isolated village in the English countryside, a housemaid named Anna Frith emerges as an unlikely heroine and healer. Through Anna's eyes we follow the story of the fateful year of 1666, as she and her fellow villagers endure a self-imposed quarantine to keep the disease from spreading. As death reaches into every household and villagers turn from prayers to murderous witch-hunting, Anna must find the strength to confront the disintegration of her community and the lure of illicit love. As she struggles to survive and grow, a year of catastrophe becomes instead annus mirabilis, a year of wonders. Inspired by a true story, Year of Wonders is a richly detailed evocation of a singular moment in history. With stunning emotional intelligence, Brooks blends love and learning, loss and renewal into a spellbinding and unforgettable read.
