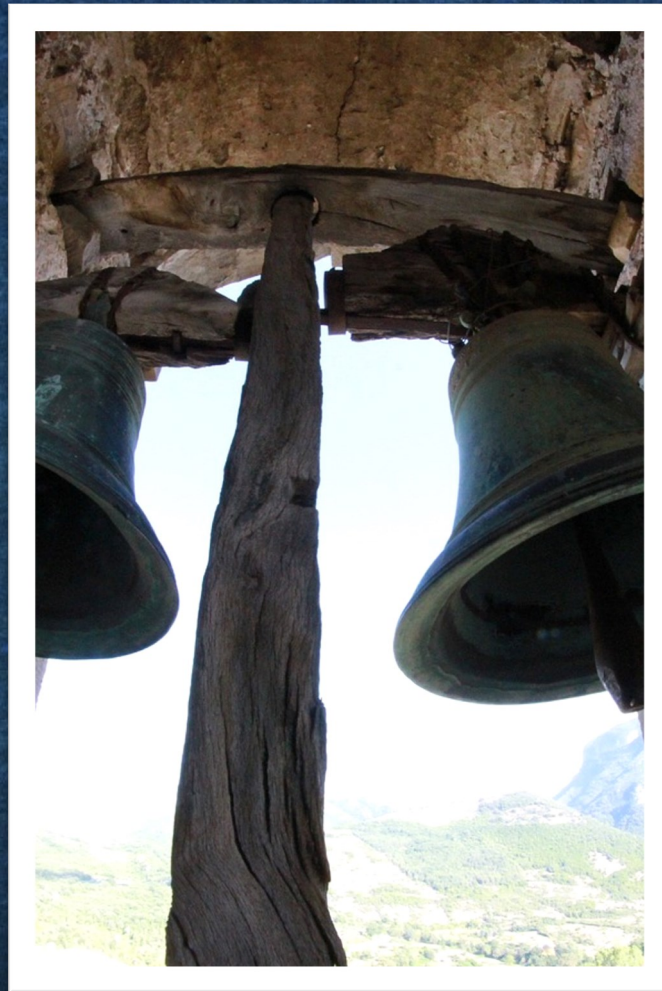

"Meditation XVII of Devotions Upon Emergent Occasions" by John Donne

The church is catholic, universal, so are all her actions; all that she does belongs to all. When she baptizes a child, that action concerns me; for that child is thereby connected to that body which is my head too and ingrafted into that body whereof I am a member. And when the church buries a person, that action concerns us. All of humanity is of one author and is one volume; when one person dies, one chapter is not torn out of the book, but it is translated into a better language; and every chapter must be so translated. God employs several translators; some pieces are translated by age, some by sickness, some by war, some by justice; but the Lord's hand is in every translation. God's hand shall bind up all our scattered leaves again for that library where every book shall lie open to one another. As therefore the bell that rings to a sermon calls not upon the preacher only but upon the congregation to come, so this bell calls us all. No one is an island entire of itself; everyone is a piece of the continent, a part of the main. If a clod be washed away by the sea, the whole earth is the less, as well as if a promontory were, as well as if a manor of thy friend's or of thine own were. Anyone's death diminishes me, because I am involved in humankind, and therefore never send to know for whom the bell tolls; it tolls for thee.
