3rd Quarter Financial Report

WESTMINSTER PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH III QUARTER 2020 FINANCIAL REPORT

This year is 75% completed and the financial position of our Church remains strong. Your pledges and identifiable unpledged offerings are the two largest parts of our income and together they represent 74.33% of their total budget for this period. The current situation has resulted in a decline of anticipated income, particularly in the payments we receive from the preschool. Our total income is 72% of budget which compares well to the 75% completion of the year.

The total expenses are 68% of budget which is below our total income, so there is a positive cash variance which is expected to continue to year end. Many of the expense categories are below budget due to the modification of activity, including utilities. The virtual Sunday activity has resulted in unanticipated internet and equipment expenses and also some personnel expenses to support this activity.

The financial position of the church is strong. The total cash position includes a Paycheck Protection Loan of 10% of our budget. The Church has abided by the conditions set by the U.S. Government and the loan is in the process of being forgiven.

The Budget and Finance Committee has always been thoughtful and frugal with the assets of our Church beginning with plans developed by Walt Friday and Bob Ohmart as Chairs of the committee many years ago. The reward is our financial stability. Special recognition should go to our Financial Secretary Dianna Calvert who has assumed the responsibilities of the Counters and Collectors and to Office Manager Jean Severson who has kept the cash flowing smoothly.

This report simply lets the congregation know things are well under control. For the more financially curious, copies of the financial statements and budget are available from the Church office.

NOVEMBER 29TH - 5TH SUNDAY Supporting ARCHES Project





A NOTE FROM STEWARDSHIP:

Your stewardship committee has been asked about the different way the Westminster general fund campaign was conducted this year. It was pretty clear we needed to conduct it via US Postal Service mail rather than in person.

The question was regarding the lack of a privacy envelope in the mailing last week for your pledge card. The reason for that omission is because the routing of the pledge cards was a bit different this year. In prior years the pledge cards, safely in their privacy envelopes, would go to the stewardship committee. Each privacy envelope had the name of the family or pledging unit on the outside. That way the stewardship committee could see WHO had returned a pledge card but NOT how much, if anything, was pledged. This was helpful in an analysis of the pledging congregation.

This year, though, the pledge cards are going directly to the financial secretary who, of course, always sees who pledged and how much. The financial secretary will report to stewardship which pledging families or units returned a card (but not the amount) and which did not.

We hope this explains the elimination of the need and expense of including a privacy envelope.



Volunteers even donated art supplies to help kids (and even adults) stay entertained while they are in temporary settings.

This is a difficult time, in many ways. Pandemic times are stressful. The economy has been in trouble, so many of our families are experiencing unemployment or underemployment, which has led to problems affording rent. Many victims of wildfires have lost their homes and cannot find places to rent even if they can afford it. There are many stories of desperation, and Family Promise/IHN is one of the entities reaching out to help.

We all know that education is a challenge for kids and families right now, for some more than others. Family Promise/IHN has received a significant contribution from Westminster, which will be used to purchase computers and support for virtual learning for children who are trying to keep up with school at a very unstable time.

We send thanks to all of those who created and delivered delicious dinners and to those who donated for all of the other needs! Please keep all of the families in your prayers.

- 2. Contact OSH Volunteer Services (503.945.2892) and arrange to deliver the bag/box directly.


GIFT A COW FOR CHRISTMAS!
