Do you not know that your bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own; you were bought at a price. - I Corinthians 6:19-20a



There are repeated calls for members of Westminster to contribute their time to the essential ministry of the church. IHN, Advent Crafts, serving on committees, teaching Sunday school, making coffee, setting up tables, cleaning the kitchen, baking some cookies, cleaning up the church grounds, office work, decorating the church for Christmas, and the list goes on through the year. Some of the requests are beyond the capacity of some of our members but certainly not all of them.

There is a developing norm in American churches that considers the church a smorgasbord of activities from which to choose. It has become another place to receive services. We come to church on Sunday to have our spirits lifted rather than to worship God. We go to educational events to have our minds stimulated instead of preparing to give answer for our faith. We look to the church to provide counseling, special services like marriage and memorials, spiritual direction, pastoral care, and support in times of crisis. We expect the church to be a place where supportive relationships develop through our fellowship and we look to the church to be an expression of our service to the community in the name of Christ. In this framework the church is a place of consumption rather than vocation and service. We start to think that the church's calendar, programs, times of worship, are about us and our convenience rather than God whom we serve. Many of us are not very involved in sharing the responsibility of this ministry. In most churches 20% of the members contribute 80% of the mission and ministry of the church. This is true of time and financial giving.

Being part of a church community is a covenant relationship. As with all covenant relationships, family, marriage, vocational, we get what we put into it. If we keep receiving without contributing, we become entitled and God becomes our servant instead of our Lord.

Discipleship, it seems has morphed into volunteerism. It has become about what we choose to give instead of answering the call to service. We use that language a lot in the church. We need volunteers to teach Sunday School, serve communion, clean-up the grounds. One of the most frequent concerns expressed by leaders in the church is that fewer and fewer people are available to volunteer for positions and service in the church. Have church members lost our sense of calling?

The church cannot be the generous, welcoming, hospitality of Christ unless we all pitch in. We are not volunteers. As we affirm in our baptism, we are no longer our own, but Christ's with all the benefits and responsibilities that come with discipleship. As we ask you to pray about your financial support of the church, I encourage you to remember that the Church is not a business providing services for which you are paying, it is the body of Christ bringing the Gospel of Christ to one another and to the world. Stewardship of the church, God's Word, and Christian mission and service is our vocation from the time we are baptized until the day we are called home.


