Grace and peace to you Westminster!

I am enjoying getting to know you and am looking forward to the coming months where I can meet many more of WPC's friends and members. I feel the ways that Covid has shaped our getting-to-know-one-another into a more measured process rather than all at once. At the same time we are also renegotiating what church means and what is the best way to go about gathering. Sometimes I like to say that we are 're-constituting the church' more than we are simply re-opening it. All together we are sorting through the mixed reality of some vaccinated, others not, cases rising in some places, not in others, social distancing inside versus outside, eating at a restaurant versus eating at a family picnic while the picture continues to shift week-in and week-out. We are not only navigating this technical side of things but we are also brokering new definitions of church, faith, and collective life. This week we will shift our Sunday morning study from Lent and Easter to the early church and utilize the stories in Acts to help us clarify what the body of Christ is meant to be in the first place.

Why do we even gather at all? One of our 20<sup>th</sup> century theologians put it this way:

"It belongs to the function of the Church, then, to enter into history in the service of reconciliation, to live out its divine life in the midst of the world's dividedness, and by living as well as witnessing, to bring humanity into the fellowship of healing and peace with God." (T.F. Torrance)

On a separate note, I wanted to give you a brief picture of what goes on during the week in-between Sundays. I communicate regularly with Session about vision casting/finances/ governance, with the staff about weekly and monthly planning, with the re-opening and worship teams about hybrid services, and with the Deacons about care for the church. This is not an exhaustive list but a little slice of a week in the life of the pastor. I like to keep an open door/ email/phone approach so if something is on your mind, please reach out and let me know.

Ever onward as God's kingdom pursues us.

### EMBRACING OUR NEW ELDERS & DEACONS

We are inviting the ORDAINED ELDERS AND DEACONS in the congregation to 'lay hands' on our newly ordained and installed elders and deacons in a Covid-19 safe manner.

Starting April 18th, and for the following 3 weeks, we will create **RED** paper cutouts of our hands with blessings written on them. They will be assembled into stoles for the new elders and deacons to wear during the installation service on May 16, 2021.

Pre-cut handprints are available in the narthex through May 9, when all handprints must be in. Take one or two and write your name and a blessing if you like. If you prefer to cut out your own at home, just trace around your hand on **RED** paper (or color it in if you only have white paper) then cut it out and write your name and a blessing on it. Then bring it or mail it to the church. All writing should be on ONE Side, as they will be glued to the stole.

## Why Bother Coming Back?

"It's Sunday morning. I sit by the gas fireplace snuggled up in a warm blanket, relishing the quiet. Before long, the rest of the family will stir, and we'll have a choice to make:

Get ready to go to church? Livestream the service at home? Watch it later? Or skip it altogether?"

..."Attending church is more complicated now. Some churches require pre-registration, masks, and hand sanitizer. Most have chairs spaced apart or pews blocked off to ensure social distancing. Some won't let you sing. Many have cancelled programming for children. And frankly, with no handshakes and no visiting in the lobby—in one door and out another—why bother going?

During the stay-at-home orders, many churches stepped up to the challenge of livestreaming services, investing in equipment and training to foster a sense of continuity. Churches that did this well are facing a new challenge: making the case to return to in-person services."


