Dear Friends:

The Bible is full of journeys. Joseph and Mary had to journey from their home town of Nazareth to Judea, where their son was born in a stable in Bethlehem, of all places. And all too soon after his birth, they were forced to endure an unwanted journey: into Egypt, as refugees, escaping the murderous intent of King Herod, insanely jealous that a new King was to be born, a real threat to his power. And Jesus is indeed a real threat to the powers of this world, for his kingdom is built on the seemingly absurd foundation of love and forgiveness: the power of love rather than the love of power. What a concept! And what if we genuinely tried that approach in our divided world today?

And though Jesus never traveled very far by our standards, his was a life always on the move - a journey that ended (until the 3rd day, anyway) with all those fateful events in Jerusalem.

We here at Westminster have just embarked on our own journey. For the first time in many years, we don't have a called pastor to lead us. We certainly want the very best for John and Gail in their new adventure, the journey into retirement. Even as we thank them for so much faithful service over so long, let's keep them in our good thoughts and prayers in this new season in their lives, rich with wonderful memories, surrounded by loving family and friends, but also a new experience for them, with both challenges and opportunities.

For us, the faithful West'y saints, our journey includes times of uncertainty, undoubtedly a few things slipping between the cracks, but also, and most important, the presence of each other (and we really do know how to do and be a church here, thankfully), and the guiding reality of God's Holy Spirit. God didn't retire; God still embraces us and leads us ahead on this new, exciting adventure of faith. Yes, things will be different and some things will change, but new possibilities and fresh opportunities and leadership will emerge. God is too faithful and too loving for it to be otherwise. Hebrews 13:8 says it well: "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever."

I'm glad to be able to be here with y'all as together we take our first steps on this new adventure. Years ago, Joan and I and our 2 small kids left the comforts of a church in the San Francisco Bay Area, where we had many friends and a familiar setting, for an adventure into a very small community in the frigid winter of Colorado - a totally new experience for us in many ways. As we left, some good friends gave us a plaque which reminded us: "I am not afraid of tomorrow, for I have seen yesterday, and I love today."


GREETINGS, WESTMINSTER FAMILY!


