What does it mean to be Presbyterian?

"Decently and in good order."

To be Presbyterian is to do things decently and in good order. This is one of our catch-phrases that captures the ways we value a calm, open and deliberative approach to living out our faith. We value solutions that weave together multiple perspectives. We celebrate many voices around the table because it fosters a robust and multi-layered understanding of God's work. This kind of habit requires patience because often the right path forward takes some time to emerge. It is a lifelong work for all of us and yet what a worthwhile pursuit during our short time on earth.

"Decently and in good order."

The art of listening and true understanding are rare commodities in our world today. To be Presbyterian is to eschew the trend of echo chambers and rapid-fire communication. It is to move out of 'one way' and into 'multi-layered ways.' I have observed a tremendous diversity of perspectives within this congregation and it is one of Westminster's strengths. When there is unbreakable covenant, this level of diversity is a gift and fosters a dynamic environment of growth and appreciation. If covenant wanes, though, it can easily devolve into polarized attitudes, such as 'my way or the highway.'

In order for a faith community like Westminster to thrive, there has to be an unwavering commitment to covenant. What exactly is covenant, you might ask? Here is a great definition of what it means: In our relationships with one another, we practice 'mutual concern, active support, and lifting up one another in prayer.' That is the definition from our own book of order (G.1.0304) about what it means to be a member of this congregation. The first two words are especially important – *mutual concern*. Behaving mutually toward one another means that we are generous when we are the majority opinion and gracious when we are in the minority. To have mutual concern for one another is to remember that it may not be too long before the tables are turned. To have mutual concern is to thwart the winner-take-all mentality. Essentially, it is to have difference without division.

Wouldn't it be lovely if the whole world operated this way?

"Decently and in good order."

In order to have the 2022 Annual Meeting with as much 'good order' as possible, the Session has discerned that Zoom is the best platform. This has the benefit of maximizing congregational access and equalizing the modes of participation.


Where Do We Go From Here?


