Dear friends,

Have you ever attended a worship service that talked about Roe v. Wade? Well, this Sunday is going to be one of those weeks. Roe is fascinating in that it simultaneously touches on so many things- religious freedom, the separation of church and state, human rights, tradition versus progress, privacy, self-agency as well as a host of other things. We will not have time to engage with it all at once so we will focus our attention on the question of tradition versus progress since ironically (and maybe it is not ironic at all), the text assigned for this week addresses this very thing. If you have a chance, I encourage you to peruse through Acts 17 and mull over how what is happening in the early church connects to our lives today. Paul is engaged in conversations about the value of things that are old versus the things that are new because he is preaching "Jesus," something that was new. Except then he goes on to say it actually is something old, just in a new form. He encounters Athenians who are active in their religious practice and he invites them to expand that sincerity into a wider kind of way and consider Jesus. In other words, to take what they have and build on it rather than remain stagnant. This sense of always learning, growing and deepening in the early church is rooted in their experience of a real and active Holy Spirit. It is in this same vein that the primary voices of the Reformation (European) appealed to the need for religious reform in their day. This is how we, as Presbyterians, have come to the motto "ecclesia reformata, semper reformanda" which means "the church reformed and always reforming." ([This is a great article](#)) Traditions that are old versus progress that is new are not inherently good or bad but instead we measure these things based on the degree of well-being and vitality that they bring into the world.

I do not anticipate that this will be the only time we will wrestle with the world around us in this kind of way. The cultural foundation which separates church and state as a means to balance power is rapidly changing before our very eyes (it has been changing for a few decades, but I digress) and needs new ways to talk about it and fresh concepts to map out "life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness." How exactly is institutional and individual power balanced in our modern era? How did the early church navigate their own concerns about agency and ownership in their lives?

I'll see you Sunday onsite and online.

"For in Christ, we live and move and have our being." -Acts 17:28

THE CROSS OF WESTMINSTER TO BE RETIRED WITH RESPECT AND PRAYER

Early in May the Buildings & Grounds committee observed a large, pecked-out hole in Westminster's beautiful cross. A closer inspection revealed the worst — over time carpenter ants had done extensive damage. Initially it was hoped the cross could be repaired, but once it was taken apart and examined, it was obvious the damage was unfixable. On May 10th the cross was carefully taken down, and is being stored on-property.

The cross has blessed WestPres since 1957, first hanging on the original chapel, then welcoming the congregation at the entrance. Our Buildings & Grounds team plans to reclaim wood from the cross, and turn it to beautiful and creative use on our campus. On July 24th Pastor Kelly will prayerfully retire the cross in ceremonies at both worship services. In the meanwhile, take a moment to consider what, if anything, might eventually replace the cross. Buildings & Grounds will happily receive all suggestions.

STEVE & CAMI MATHER— PROVIDING A HAVEN FOR UKRAINIAN REFUGEES

For many years, Members and Friends of Westminster have supported the work of Steve & Cami Mather (son and daughter-in-law of Pauline and Richard Mather) and their nonprofit, Stepping Forward Ministries ("SFM"). Their ongoing work with children and orphans in Romania has been a source of inspiration; our WestPres youth traveled there on a legendary mission trip to lend support as volunteers.

Now it's time for us to 'step forward' as a congregation to support Steve & Cami as they open their doors to more than 40 Ukrainian refugees. "I was at the border myself a couple weeks ago," Steve wrote. "Watching the mothers and children with only a backpack and a small carry-on suitcase was so hard to watch. Many of these people expected the war to be over in a couple of weeks or they left in a hurry, or the small children were just not able to carry much..." SFM will house, feed, and clothe the refugees, and also needs to prepare the camp for the cold winter months to come, which is a costly task. Your prayers and donations are needed to help SFM through this challenging time. Thank you in advance for any contributions!



WHAT IS PER CAPITA? You hear about it every year around this time but what is it really? This is a little introductory article on Per Capita. Westminster Presbyterian is a part of the Presbyterian Church (USA). We are a connectional denomination with a General Assembly at the national level which is made up of regional Synods which are made up of regional Presbyteries which are made up of local churches. Westminster Salem is a part of the Cascades Presbytery which is a part of the Synod of the Pacific. The regional bodies, Presbytery, Synod, and General Assembly do not have income sources per se for their operations but instead rely on the local churches together to support them. Every year we are asked to pay a set amount of money, **THIS YEAR PER CAPITA IS \$39 FOR EACH MEMBER.** \$39 times 378 members which is how many members we had on 12/31/2020 [it is always one year behind] = \$14,742. There is a line item in our 2022 budget for \$14,742 which is the amount that we will be paying to the Presbytery for our Per Capita. The Presbytery will forward the appropriate amount on to each of the other regional bodies mentioned above. The breakdown is as follows:

The per capita apportionment for each member is \$39.00 and shared as follows:

- ◆ The General Assembly \$ 8.98 (Unchanged from 2020)
- ◆ The Synod Of The Pacific \$ 5.20 (Unchanged from 2014)
- ◆ The Presbytery of the Cascades \$24.82 (Increased \$2.52 from 2021)

What we are asking each church member to do is to make an extra \$39 donation to the church to cover their portion of the per Capita. If every member pays their \$39 this effectively lowers the amount we need to meet our annual budget by \$14,742. Please go online now to salemwestpres.org and click on the Donate button. Be sure to select the Per Capita Fund from the drop-down list. OR write a check and in the memo line indicate "Per Capita". One thing to consider as you make your donation: There may be some who are unable to make an extra \$39 donation. Consider making a donation for yourself plus an extra \$39 for someone else. Thank you!

REMINDER: DEACONS HAVE RESUMED HOME COMMUNION AND RIDES TO CHURCH





