UPCOMING S.O.A.R. (Sunday Opportunity for Adult Renewal) LESSONS FROM THE BORDER CRISIS

On Sunday, February 24th, join us in Russell Hall at either

9:45 or **11:00** to hear from Willamette College of Law Professor Warren Binford. Professor Binford is one of a small handful of experts from around the country who has government clearance to interview immigrant children and families, including those forcibly separated, and to inspect and report on the conditions in which the children and their parents are being detained. Come gain an understanding of the humanitarian aid crisis at the border and the challenges we face from someone with firsthand knowledge and expertise.

REFUGEE SUPPER CLUB UPDATE

Our November Supper Club Potluck was a great success, with over 100 attendees. The next Supper Club event will be a picnic at Riverfront Park in June.


