

Dear Westminster Members,

For I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope. (Jeremiah 29:11)

Twenty-one months ago, we began an intentional partnership to prepare the way for Westminster to call a new pastor. I told you the process could take between 12 and 18 months. I explained that my job was to stretch your muscles and increase your flexibility so you could be agile as you began to perform the Gospel with a new conductor. Unfortunately, this turned into boot camp with multiple workouts that have left all of us aching. The good news is that you have not only survived but proven the resilience to respond to deep change. In every sphere of our lives, work, play, family, and church we have had to adapt. Most of you have done this gracefully.

This week, you called a new pastor. I rejoice with you and commend the PNC for working, adjusting, and persevering in a difficult transitional process that was not easily adapted to a pandemic. I commend the session for their faithful service. They were there when difficult decisions needed to be made.

"Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who empowers them all in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good."

(I Corinthians 12:4-7)

Paul reminds us that we each have gifts and Christ enjoins us to use them for the common good. Like a symphony orchestra, each of you has a part to play. You are getting a new conductor. Your elders are the first chairs in each section. The symphony you are playing is your mission. There are other symphonies, other conductors, other musicians in the great collection of the Gospel but you have a particular symphony and distinct parts to play in this performance called Westminster Presbyterian Church. All orchestras have different conductors during their life. First chairs sometimes change, as do the performers. You have a new conductor. You may be an accomplished musician and think that you have a good knowledge of how you should play your part. But if you don't follow the lead of a conductor you can spoil the whole performance. Everyone has to play their role for the common mission of the church.

It will take some time for you to learn the conductor's cues. Practice makes perfect (or maybe it is better to say practice perfects). Play together. Follow the notes but listen for the nuance of a conductor's vision for the symphony.

Westminster has a bright future ahead as you work together, following the lead of your new conductor.



2021 PER CAPITA

By now you should have received a postal service letter regarding the Westminster per capita assessment. It tells how much each member is asked to contribute to that fund.

As you may already know every year Presbyterian churches are asked to support the wider church as we celebrate our Reformed heritage and Presbyterian identity. To do that we make Per Capita contributions that are based on our membership roll (number of adult or confirmed members).

The services provided from per capita contributions benefit all congregations equally. These include administrative, legislative and judicial functions at all levels of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) including the national General Assembly, regional Synod of the Pacific and local Presbytery of the Cascades.

This year in particular Westminster benefitted as we used these services during the planning and search for a new Pastor candidate. In the past we also benefitted greatly from the Synod's lending service which allowed us to borrow money to finance Boulder Hall at an extremely good rate!

The Westminster congregation gets all this advice and service for the low per member assessment of just \$36.50 each. As a reminder Presbytery kept this amount the same as last year despite increasing costs in many areas.

The benches are located in the backyard of Winola House and will be used and appreciated for many years to come.




Where there's a will....
