*Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.” - Matthew 28:19-20*



Just a few months ago, Westminster Presbyterian received Diana Weber, daughter of James and Kelsey Weber into the family of faith through baptism.
