

# **Deanna White – Biography**

Deanna White began her education in art and design during her years at Cal Poly Humboldt, investigating such diverse expressions as sculpture, photography, theater costume design and puppetry, as well as the more traditional drawing and painting curriculum. She expanded her exploration of art by touring Europe, where she attended the Hohensalzburg Art Academy in Salzburg, Austria.

Deanna's painting style draws on the drama and hyperbole of her theater arts training. Magenta hills, cerulean skies and bright gamboge tree trunks adorn her fantasy expression of the Mid Willamette Valley, which she sees in the woods and gardens on her daily walks and plein Aire excursions. Landscapes, people and still lifes painted in acrylic or soft pastel and collage currently make up most of Deanna White's portfolio.

Deanna has been married to her husband Glen for 44 years and has two sons. She has explored many vocations during her life such as a woodshop instructor, dental assistant for 20 years, an antique dealer and an MA for a Vascular Surgeon. Concurrently for the last 23 years she has taught Watercolor, Encaustic and Pastel classes through Chemeketa College, Currents Gallery, SAA, KAA and her home studio.

Her work can be seen at Bush Barn Gallery, Currents Gallery, River Gallery, Elsinore Gallery and Corvalis Art Center.

### **Artist's Statement**

"My art is about imagination and the emotional value of color. I take great delight in translating a landscape, still life or portrait into my own interpretation of that image using fantasy, vibrant color and simplifying shapes. Dwellings, landscapes, still lifes and human connections are my favorite subjects. My goal in painting is to achieve an 'Alice in her looking glass' effect, so the viewer's imagination will want to step inside the painting and live there for a moment".

Artist's Process and medias: I work in collage, acrylic and pastel predominately.

Acrylic is one of favorite mediums as I am able to do a red, black or "hombre" underpainting on a birch panel and then sketch with a water-based pencil to allow for mistakes. I enjoy adding a certain quirkiness to my compositions by moving trees like furniture around and adding extra dwellings with connecting roads to add interest. Then I paint, mixing colors and using short strokes for texture.

Collage is like assembling a puzzle. I begin with a sketch on a panel and make color decisions and then each shape is cut and glued with thought given to textures and values. Layering papers give the work even more depth and texture. I use anything flat for collage materials such as magazines, book font, Josh papers, leaves, stamps, lace, maps and handmade and purchased papers.

Pastels are great for landscapes as they give me the freedom to use the rich colors that I love, adding vibrancy and movement with each stroke without the hassle of drying paint. The use of colored and sanded papers gives my pastels a richness and depth.
