VACATION **BIBLE SCHOOL** IS NEXT WEEK!


It's not too late to register your children, grandchildren,

#### Dear Friends-



*Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and* 

*teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age.* 

Matthew 28:19 - 20

During this time, as a congregation, we are going to journey through several steps designed to help a congregation prepare for a new installed pastor. These transitional tasks include examining our history, exploring our identity and direction, examining leadership needs, strengthening our connections (which includes connections with our denomination, presbytery, and local ministry partners).

During this time we will do a Mission Study that will make use of the results of your Appreciative Inquiry process, a demographics study, to determine who are our neighbors, and write a Mission Information Form that will help potential candidates determine if Westminster is a good match for them. Both our Mission Study and our Mission Information Form will be a collaborative effort with the Commission on Ministry who will be our partner in this process.

Following the approval of the Mission Study, the Commission on Ministry will give us permission to appoint a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) that will be a broad representation of the congregation. They will receive the Personal Information Forms of potential candidates and begin the discernment process that will narrow the search to several candidates they will interview. This process includes phone calls, video conferences, and finally face to face interviews. Each of the candidates that are interviewed face to face will also be examined by the Commission on Ministry for eligibility to serve in Cascades Presbytery and they will preach at a neutral pulpit for the PNC.

This whole process is frustrating for the congregation because all of this is done in confidentiality. I will explain reasons for this later in more detail. Finally, the PNC will nominate a candidate who will then be called, will preach a "candidating sermon" for the congregation and then be elected to serve by the congregation.

#### INTERFAITH HOSPITALITY NETWORK - July 14-21

IHN families arrive at Westminster July 14. This Family Promise/Interfaith Hospitality ministry is a time for our church to be part of a community effort to end homelessness, by welcoming families in need of emergency shelter. Westminster's efforts combine with those of 18 other churches and the amazing staff at the Day Center.



This is the second of three times each year that volunteers have the opportunity to provide breakfast, dinner and place to sleep for families with young children. Volunteers are needed to provide these meals, to welcome guests as evening hosts, and to sleep at the church as overnight hosts.

Three ways that this ministry makes a real difference:

- To feed and safely shelter families with young children here at church
- To be a support as these families move through the process of planning, budgeting and often job searches while IHN staff works with them
- To serve **together** as we follow God's call to be a place of hospitality and caring


