Dear Friends—

But about that day or hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. As it was in the days of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man... Therefore keep watch, because you do not know on what day your Lord will come.

- Matthew 24:36-37

Transition is a time of discernment but it is not a time for standing still. Waiting is a popular theme during the Advent season. Waiting and watching show up a lot in the scriptures of this season. Unfortunately, in Western cultures, waiting is usually in the passive tense. In the scriptures, however, waiting and watching are active verbs. They imply that waiting is not a passive activity but an active one. Henry Nouwen's reflections on active waiting are insightful and practical:

- People who wait have received a promise that allows them to wait.
- While waiting, we are to be fully present in the moment, believing that this moment is the moment.
- A waiting person is a patient person who believes something hidden will be evident to us.
- Waiting is open-ended, filled with hope for what God desires to bring us beyond our imagination.
- We wait together.
- We wait patiently in expectation.

This transitional season in the life of Westminster is not a time for standing still. We are not waiting for a new pastor in the passive tense. God expects our waiting to be active. We are to continue responding to the call of Christ, following in his footsteps and going where he leads us even while we are waiting for new leadership. We are not going to be just sitting around until the new pastor comes. We are not going to say, "lets wait till the new pastor comes." In fact, what is going to be attractive to the kind of new pastor you seek is some evidence that you are good disciples who continue to do the work you are called to do even when you don't have an installed pastor. People committed to the call and work of Christ are the kind of people with whom pastor's like to serve.


